Molina Transportation Benefits

Are your Molina patients having difficulty getting transportation to and from your office for their appointments? Each year, Molina members are eligible to have as many as 15 round-trip (or 30 one-way trips) for medical appointments and trips to the pharmacy. Care Navigation is designed for children and families with complex medical problems or special health care needs and/or families who have many people involved with the children's health care. This includes patients who may be new to managed care including children in foster care and those receiving services from the Bureau of Children with Medical Handicaps (BCMh).
