**2017 Physician Incentive Plan Reimbursement Rates**

The Per Successful Patient (PSP) reimbursement rates and the Pharmacy Shared Savings target for the 2017 Physician Incentive Plan have been calculated! The goal of the program is for PFK to make available a similar amount of potential incentive dollars to its community practices and physicians in 2017 as was available in 2016. The following rates are modeled to achieve that goal.

As a reminder, practices will be incentivized for each patient who completes one of the well checks listed above. Your practice will also receive 25% of the per member per month (PMPM) savings if the expense for the members attributed to your practice for the four medication classes listed above is less than the per member per month target. **2016 Physician Incentive Plan True Up Payments**

Each year PFK completes a final sweep of claims for the preceding measurement year to catch any incentive activity our initial calculations may have missed due to claims having been processed and paid in the following measurement year, late filings, appeals or other data gaps. This is referred to as the “True Up” calculation and it is included in the checks for the first quarter of each measurement year. As an example, PFK’s next incentive check which will be distributed later this month will be for the first quarter of 2017 and will include any True Up payments your practice is due for 2016. This check will also include payment for approved proof forms received prior to July 28.

**ADHD Developmental Screening Reimbursement Guidelines**

Per Ohio Medicaid Guidelines, one ADHD Brief Emotional Behavioral Assessment with scoring and documentation (CPT code 96127) will be reimbursed per year.
