Why does ADHD cause so many problems in school? What are the most common academic problems that arise with ADHD? How does ADHD cause these academic problems? What can we do to help kids with these problems? School can be a significant challenge for the child who has ADHD. Join us in identifying the most common academic performance problems that arise, why they occur and what we can do to promote success at home and in the classroom.

Alternative Treatments... What's in the News

While prescription medications and behavioral management are the cornerstone to effective treatment for ADHD, parents often wonder if nonconventional or alternative treatments can also be effective. Behavior Management

Parents often have questions about medications for ADHD and may be apprehensive about using medications for treating ADHD in their child. This session offers an in-depth discussion on the physiology of ADHD, the variety of medication options available for treating ADHD and how they function.

Are you wondering how to help your child with ADHD have better self-esteem? In this class, we will expand and improve your understanding of how self-esteem develops, how ADHD may impact self-esteem, as well as learn ways to improve and support the self-esteem of the child with ADHD.

Social Skills

Children with ADHD often have difficulties with personal interactions. In this course, we will discuss ADHD behaviors and how they may impact social skill development. We will also help parents identify areas for improvement in their own child and examine practical strategies to help parents encourage and reinforce positive social skill development.

Stress Management

Research has shown that parents of children with ADHD suffer high levels of stress, depression, anxiety, blame, and marital discord. These high levels, left untreated, can lead to health issues and negatively affect the quality of life for everyone. This session focuses on how parents can take good care of themselves.

Do you ever get upset with your brother or sister? Do you wonder why he/she seems to get “all the attention?” This session is designed to help school-age siblings better understand what the deal is with ADHD, why their siblings act the way they do, and what they can do to help the situation for themselves and their family. ***This class is for children ages 8-12, who have a sibling with ADHD only. The ADHD child should not attend this class. All children must be accompanied by an adult who is registered for the class. To register your child, please contact (614) 355-0589.***
